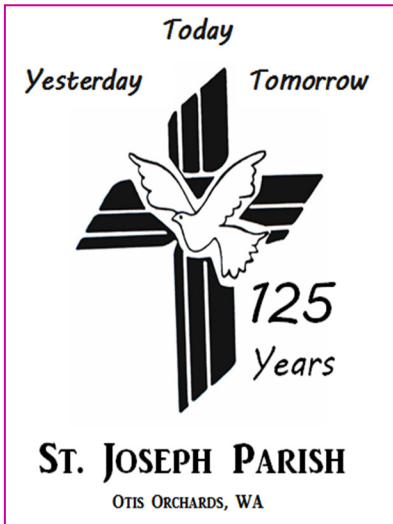

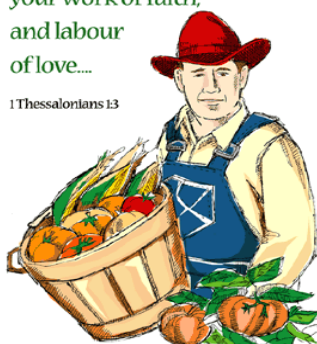

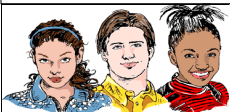


Religious Education for 4 year olds—7th Grade Building a Community of Faith for Our Children
